The University of Huddersfield welcomes applications from students who have taken an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ). It believes that the skills that students develop through the

EPQ are directly relevant to and useful for university level study. For the majority of courses, the University of Huddersfield make offers which can include the UCAS Tariff points gained from the EPQ - but please check their website for the specific entry requirements.



Newcastle University values the skills of research and independent learning that the Extended Project is designed to develop and welcomes applications from students offering an Extended Project alongside other

qualifications of an appropriate level.



The University of Sheffield encourages students to complete an EPQ, where possible, as it values the development of skills in independent study and research which an EPQ can offer. An EPQ in the subject that is related to the course or discipline that you wish to progress into may be taken into account by admissions tutors when making decisions between applicants of equal academic standing.

Southampton

Many courses make an alternative offer alongside our traditional offer, if a student has done an EPQ. The alternative offer will be one grade reduced from our traditional offer in exchange for an A in the EPQ. For example, History, whose traditional offer is AAB will make an alternative offer of ABBa. It is our hope that this will send out a clear message to students that we value the EPQ, and appreciate the hard work that goes into completing one. We also hope that this will serve to encourage more students to undertake the EPQ, reduce the number that drop out once university offers come in, and also result in more EPQ students applying to us. We have an increasingly compelling evidence base that students who did well at the EPQ settle in well to their undergraduate study at a research-intensive university like ours, and so are keen to see more of them in our lecture theatres and seminar rooms.
