KS4 Options Process

Features of GCSEs:

- A grading scale of 9 to 1 is used, with 9 being the top grade
- Assessed mostly by exams at the end of Year 11



GCSE Grading

- ✓ **English Language**
- ✓ **English Literature**
- ✓ **Mathematics**
- ✓ **Science** (*Combined or Separate*)
- ✓ (*Physical Education*)
- ✓ (*Religious Education*)



The Core Subjects

Combined Science (Core)

- 2 GCSEs
- 9 hours of curriculum time
- Higher and Foundation Tiers



Separate Science (Core + 1 Option)

- 3 GCSEs
- 14 hours of curriculum time
- Higher Tier Only



Science Pathways

Combined Science (Core)

- This is a course suitable for students of all abilities.
- Students can transition to A Level Science from Combined GCSE.



Separate Science (Core + 1 Option)

- Students in top set Science should consider this option.
- Students in other sets should consider this course if they are achieving well in Science.

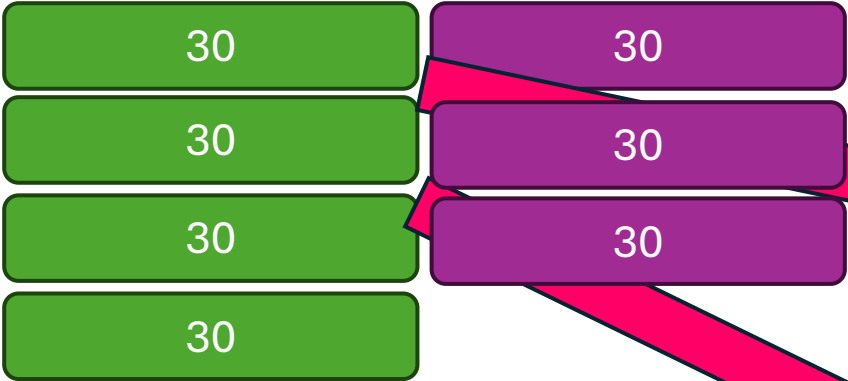


Science Pathways

X and Y Band in Core Subjects

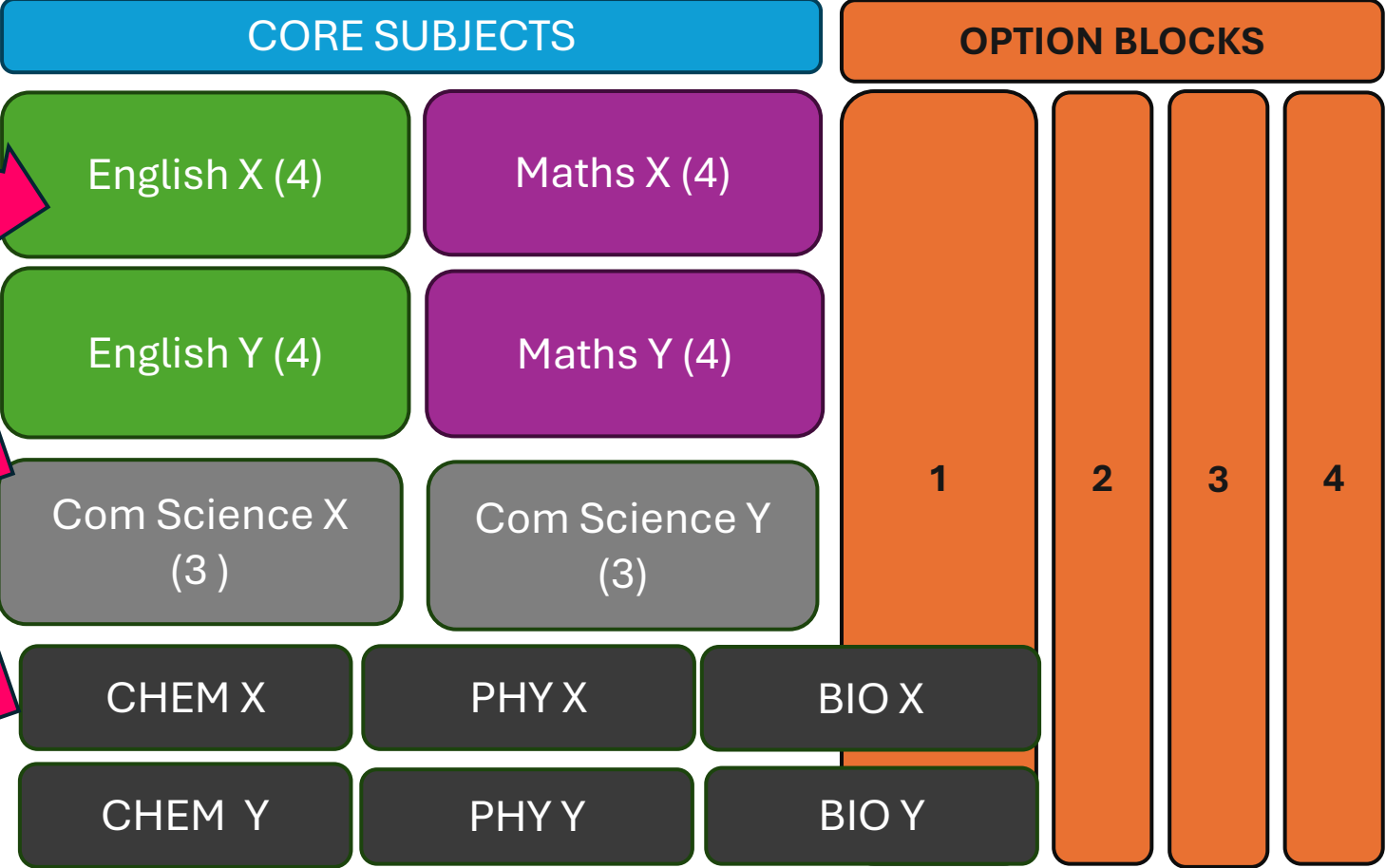
- Currently there are 4 groups in the X Band and 3 groups in the Y band
- We add an extra class in core subjects for Year 10 and Year 11
- This is to support achievement in core subjects
- **We will move students to balance the bands**
- Students do not move tutor groups
- **Options are not taught in bands**

KEY STAGE 3: X and Y Band



There are two “sides” of the year: one with four forms and one with three. Our pupil admission number is 210 and necessitates this **imbalance**.

GCSE



Maths, English and Comb. Science have some **re-balancing** necessitating band moves.
Separate science require two **equal** classes in each band

Options are mixed groups from the entire year.

Making Your Choices

Broad and Balanced-

This has always been a key principle, and we believe at this stage of education selecting a range of subjects from different areas keeps future options open.

To support this principle, we require all students to keep one traditional academic subject as part of their GCSE options.

Making Your Choices

Academic Rigour and Future Pathways-

- Many students of you may wish to go to university in the future and need to be aware that many courses require students to have studied particular subjects at A-level.
- Some Universities do ask for a minimum of two traditional academic subjects at A-level as a requirement for certain courses, these are often referred to as facilitating subjects.
- The facilitating subjects are **biology, chemistry**, English literature, **geography, history**, maths, further maths, **French/Spanish**, and **physics**.
- Some careers that you are considering might need specific A levels or Vocational Courses

Making Your Choices

Assessment-

- Some option subjects have coursework as part of their assessment and others are solely assessed by exams at the end of the course.
- Selecting subjects that are assessed in a different way may help spread workload and suit your learning style.

Making Your Choices

Personal Strengths and Aptitude-

- You should always consider the subjects that they enjoy and are good at!

Making Your Choices

Workload and Support-

- For some of you studying nine GCSES that are assessed at the end of the course through written examinations is not the best choice.
- Within the option choices there are subjects that have practical skills as part of their assessment, and we also have a Vocational option that does not lead to a GCSE or GCSE equivalent.
- For some of you a combination of options with practical assessment and the Vocational option is more suitable.
