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Transition

At Tarporley, our priority is to ensure that all students are made to feel welcome, especially those transferring from Primary to Secondary school each autumn.

Very strong links exist between our partner Primary Schools and the High School, ensuring the fullest possible knowledge of the student and curriculum arrangements in each school throughout the year.

Our comprehensive and supportive transition programme is designed to ensure that students who join Tarporley settle in easily and make friends quickly.

Throughout the year we have a full liaison programme which includes three Curriculum Challenge Days, taster mornings and a residential visit to the Conway Centre in North Wales. Our residential trip provides an opportunity for students to build relationships and develop new friendships in a safe and structured setting.

Students are also encouraged to embrace new experiences and are challenged to set high aspirations in preparation for their journey to Secondary school.

Key Stage 3

At Tarporley, we strive to nurture and develop successful learners for the future, equipped with the skills that will enable them to prosper and achieve in the 21st Century.

We therefore embrace a curriculum that is broad, well balanced and flexible enough to meet the needs of each individual.

All students are encouraged and supported to achieve their full potential and to celebrate their successes. We firmly believe that by making learning challenging, innovative and engaging we help our students acquire the skills to become resilient, resourceful and reflective learners, both within and beyond the classroom.

During the first three years, students study a curriculum that promotes depth and challenge and one which is carefully sequenced, building on work at Primary School to develop the knowledge, skills and understanding which form the foundation for future study at Key Stage 4 and beyond.

Our Key Stage 3 Curriculum includes the following subjects: English, Mathematics, Science, French, Spanish, Geography, History, Religious Education, Art, Design and Technology, Music, Drama, Physical Education, Information Communication Technology and Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (PSHCE).



Key Stage 5

Students who choose to stay on at school and join our Sixth Form College can choose from a wide range of A Level courses.

There are also opportunities to gain qualifications in other areas such as the Extended Project Qualification, Duke of Edinburgh's Gold Award and Student Leadership.

The academic structure and pastoral systems in the Sixth Form are very strong and are there to support our students throughout their A-level studies. From the beginning of Year 12 through induction, monitoring of academic progress and guidance throughout the year, to post 17 and post 18 choices, our students are given personalised support in order to maximise their chances of success.

As well as highly experienced tutors, we are fortunate to have a Sixth Form Pastoral Manager who works full time with our students, providing specific and personalised support including study skills and academic support.

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




Broadening horizons

At Tarporley High School and Sixth Form College we also provide an exceptional variety of learning opportunities beyond the classroom. Over recent years, students have benefitted from visits to local museums, theatre productions, language tours to France, Germany and Spain, rugby tours to France, a drama trip to New York USA, ski trips to Europe and America, art residentials in Tuscany and charity work in Borneo. We believe these trips enable our students to immerse themselves in other cultures, broaden their international perspectives and develop themselves as global citizens.

A carefully considered PSHE curriculum threads through all key stages; offering strucutred learning about the world ahead of them and exceptional careers education ensures our learners are well prepared for the world of work in modern Britain.



Extra-curricular

An extensive range of clubs and extra-curricular activities take place during lunchtimes and after school, catering for a wide variety of interests including music, drama, dance, film, literature, debating, journalism, cooking and personal fitness.

For our older students, there are also wider opportunities to develop leadership and team working skills through the Duke of Edinburgh's Award and through student ambassador and leadership roles within our school and across our primary and secondary partnerships. Students are regularly complimented on their exemplary behaviour, team working and communication skills and confidence when representing our school within and beyond our local community. We are exceptionally proud of all their achievements.
