What careers support do we offer Students?



Our careers education, information, advice and guidance delivery includes:

- Careers education sessions during our three Aspire days, due to Covid-19 restrictions this
 year, this provision will be provided during our Wednesday enrichment slot. Key themes
 include; employability skills, stereotypes, employer, FE & HE encounters, local labour
 market information and Post-14, Post-16 and Post-18 pathways.
- Y7 -11 Step Up booklets completed during tutor time. The booklets provide skills to ensure progression with student's career development.
- 1:1 career guidance interview with a professionally qualified and experienced Careers Advisor for all students in Y11. Students in Y7-Y10 can request an interview through their tutor. 6th form students are offered the opportunity of another interview.
- Work experience, students in Y10 will undertake a two-week placement in June/July and students in Y12 will undertake a one-week placement in March. Due to the current pandemic we are reviewing our provision for this academic year.
- Start online platform, students from Y7-Y11 create a Start profile providing them with the opportunity to investigate labour market information such as pathways, local employer information and opportunities, employability skills. Students revisit the platform throughout their journey and have the opportunity to record their development. More information regarding the platform will be sent out after half-term, however, the link to the specific Chester and Warrington area can be found in the useful websites later in the newsletter.
- Year 9 Options process support through aspire day sessions focusing on pathways and decision-making, assemblies, options evening and parents evening.
- Year 11 Post-16 support through aspire day sessions focusing on pathways and decision-making, assemblies, 6th form open evening, FE college talks and information on how to access Apprenticeship vacancies.
- Careers Displays in each subject area to highlight possible jobs where the subject can lead. Careers and employability skills are embedded into lessons by all subject areas.
- We track the destinations of all our pupils as they prepare to finish Year 11 and 13, supporting them to move on to their chosen pathway.

Post -16 Options



The decisions students make about their next steps, are very important ones. We are here to support all of our Year 11 students with making informed choices. Our Careers Adviser will start her careers interview guidance sessions from Monday 12th October and all students in year 11 will receive a careers guidance interview throughout the year.



The advice is impartial and always in the best interests of the young person.

Careers guidance interviews can also be provided on request, students or parents should speak to their tutor who can pass on the request.

Open events

Tarporley High School 6th Form virtual open evening will be held on Thursday 15th October. Our sixth form team has been sending out lots of information and Y11 students will have an assembly this week and further information will be sent leading up to the evening.


Wednesday 11th November, designed to feel exactly like a Careers Fair, just on your

Helping your child with careers decisions



An increasingly competitive job market, high youth unemployment, and rising fees for higher education all impact on a young person's plans, making it even more important for them to make the right choices for their education, training and employment.

As they make choices and plans for the future, young people need support from the people who know them best, their families. There are many ways that parents can offer support with choices. Here are a few ideas for parents.

- Talk to your child about careers they are interested in. Find out what they know already and encourage them to find out more.
- Encourage your child to find out about what courses, jobs and training opportunities are available locally using the sources available to them.
- Visit the Start platform with your child and discuss their interests, skills and qualities.
 Encourage them to engage with local labour market information and recognise important employability skills.
- Find out what choices your child has to make in Year 9.
- Make the most of open day opportunities. Your child may be considering post 16 study at a different institution to their current school and it is important to explore all of the options.
- Encourage your child to investigate alternative pathways such as Apprenticeships and traineeships so they are fully informed of all options available.
- Get involved with plans for post-18 study. If your child is intending to enter higher education they need to plan ahead carefully. They need to think about:
 - what subject/s they want to study
 - which institutions offer relevant courses
 - whether the program of study suits their needs
 - will their GCSE grades and expected results from A levels (or equivalent) meet the course's entry requirements?
 - whether there is a work placement as part of the course
 - whether they want to study close to home or move further afield; and
 - whether the campus offers other facilities which are important to them e.g. sports facilities.

It is important to support your child to reach their own decisions about their future. Providing support and encouragement is immensely important and the more you know about the information, advice and guidance that is available and where it can be accessed the better.


