
Our careers programme



Career Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) contributes to student achievement by raising aspirations, confidence and motivation. Our careers programme informs students of the range of pathways available and raises awareness of the workplace skills and careers relevant to curriculum subjects they study. As well as engaging and inspiring students in the world of work through employer and educational encounters and visits.

Career related learning provides our students with a range of opportunities beyond the core curriculum which support their development so students are fully equipped for the next phase of their lives. Delivery through Aspire days, tutorial programme and curriculum areas, helps students understand the relationship between their own employability skills and the needs of the local labour market, whilst improving their career management skills. Our careers programme allows students to see skill progression and empowers them to make informed choices at transition phases through impartial careers advice.

Y9 GCSE Options





This term is an important time for Y9 students in preparing to making their option choices and there are a number of online resources available to support students with these important decisions

Students can access a range of resources in the Y9 Options Folder on the Pathways and Careers section of the VLE by clicking the link <u>here</u>. Resources include:

- 2020 options booklet (the 2021 version will be sent in the coming weeks)
- Three tutor sessions that were planned to be delivered to students this half-term. The sessions focus on investigating the different options subjects, the different qualification and pathways and the importance of good decision making. Please feel free to look at these sessions with your child and use the accompanying worksheets for support.
- Step Ahead booklet students have been completing careers tasks in this booklet during registration, the following tasks in the booklet support students with their options choices; Task M – using reliable information, Task N – Qualifications and Task L Eastern Delights.
- Subjects Digital Guides students can access digital guides for most subjects here, the guides
 provide information on skills gained from studying the subject, why to choose the subject and
 future qualifications it can lead to and, future job roles and careers the subject may lead to.

Start Profile

All students in Y9 have created a Start Profile and they can access their profile using this <u>link</u> There is a module entitled **'Choosing GCSE Options'** that students can work through. The module can be accessed through the following steps:

- o In the 'My Activities' section students click on 'see all modules and activities'
- o Scroll down and click on 'Making My Choices' tab
- Click on 'Open Module' on the top option 'Choosing GCSE options', students should read through the information and complete the activities for the 3 modules

If students have issues accessing their start profile, they can click on the forgot password option and this will send a reset link to the email address they registered with. Alternatively, if students can't remember their details, please email me.

Post -16 Options



I know this period of uncertainty is extremely difficult for our Y11 students, so information regarding careers provision available during this time this crucial. The links below provide students with access to resources to support them in making choices about their next steps and in applying for courses or apprenticeships.

Students can access a range of resources in the Y11 Careers Support folder on Pathways and Careers section of the VLE by clicking the link <u>here</u>. Resources include:



- The tutor sessions delivered last half-term to support students with planning for the future and considering all of the Post-16 options available to them.
- The tutor sessions that were due to be delivered this half-term, these consist of sessions on personal branding, writing a CV, writing a personal statement, making applications and interview preparation. Each session has a worksheet to support, please encourage your child to use these resources to support the process of applying for future courses or apprenticeships.
- The Step Future booklet students have been completing activities in the booklet during registration and tasks E N will help students in considering their post-16 options and preparing themselves to apply for future courses and apprenticeships.
- Subjects digital guides these guides provide students with information on the skills gained from studying subjects, the careers paths in terms of future qualifications and the job roles and careers the subject can lead to. I would encourage students who are unsure of which subjects they are interested in studying further to spend some time looking over these guides.

Start Profile

All students in Y11 have created a Start Profile and they can access their profile using this <u>link</u>. There are two modules students can work through – 'Making Post-16 Choices' & 'Apprenticeships'. These modules can be accessed through the following steps:

O In the 'My Activities' section students click on 'see all modules and activities'

O Scroll down and click on 'Making My Choices' tab

O Click on 'Open Module' on the option 'Making Post-16 Choices' – students should read through the information and complete the activities for the module. They can then do the same for the 'Apprenticeships' module.

The Start profile is tailored to Chester & Warrington, so students can access further information on studying in Cheshire & Warrington from the menu on the top right of the home screen. I would encourage all Y11 students who are still unsure of their next steps to spend time on Start looking at their Post-16 options.

If students have issues accessing their start profile, they can click on the forgot password option and this will send a reset link to the email address they registered with. Alternatively, if students can't remember their details, please email me.

Careers Guidance Interviews

Our Careers Guidance Interviews will continue to operate remotely during this time and appointments will be made and conducted using Microsoft Teams.

Our Careers Advisor will conduct 30-minute interviews which will take place on a Tuesday and Wednesday each week. Students, parents and teaching staff will be informed of when the interview will take place and the careers advisor will send the student a Teams invite to attend. During this time students will attend the careers interview Teams meeting rather than their normal live lesson, once the interview has finished, students should re-join their Teams lesson.

Students and parents will be emailed a copy of the guidance notes.


