Year 7 Foreign Language Spelling Bee National Final 2023

Since September 2022, our year 7 students have been taking part in the national Foreign Language Spelling Bee competition.

We are extremely proud of all our students and we were delighted that 2 of our students represented the North West region in the National Final at Cambridge University, Friday June 30th. In this final stage of the competition, students were tested on 300 words and competed against the other regional winners from around the UK. Both students did exceptionally well and, although not winners on the day, they were in the final 98 out of the 21,099 who started the competition this year and they did so well.

This trip has taught me more about animals than I could have ever expected-but on a more positive note, the highlight of my year will forever be getting selfie of the year with one of the fiercest big cats.'
