# Introduction

Welcome to our school uniform directory. September 2026 marks a new era for our school uniform. It follows a change in guidance for school uniform that has been enshrined in law. Additionally, we conducted a process of consultation across students, families and staff.

The key government requirement is for schools to limit uniform to **three branded items** and to allow alternatives readily available elsewhere for all other uniform items.

# Behaviour Policy

This uniform guide is mentioned explicitly in the school's behaviour policy and, as such, forms part of the school's behaviour policy. **Any** reasonable actions taken to uphold uniform standards sit within the scope of our behaviour policy's aims.

# Legal Framework

**In the UK, schools have the legal right to set uniform policies, enforce them with sanctions, and confiscate items under specific conditions, as outlined by the Department for Education (DfE).**

Schools in England can require pupils to wear a uniform, provided the policy is reasonable, non-discriminatory, and clearly communicated. The DfE guidance on uniform makes clear that the enforcement of uniform policies may include sanctions such as detentions, exclusions or suspensions, but these must align with the school's behaviour policy and be proportionate.

Regarding confiscation, the *“Searching, Screening and Confiscation” guidance* (updated July 2023) empowers school staff to confiscate items that are banned by school rules.

Our school uniform policy is formulated with consideration of the equality act and if parents or carers have questions regarding protected characteristics and their relationship with our school uniform they should contact the school.

# Polo shirt – plain, light blue “school” polo shirt

*No logo, no trim, no piping.*

# Shoes - all black, flat and ankle height.



Tights: black or grey only

Socks: plain black, white or grey **ankle** socks



*In cold weather socks may be worn over tights but these must match the colour of the tights.*



*No knee-high. No logos. No contrasting with tights.* 10

# Summer term *optional* shorts

## Grey, tailored as school trousers



**Tailored** “school style” grey shorts **must** be worn with plain black, white or grey ankle socks.



*No logo, no trim, no piping.*

# Outerwear

- Students may wear a **coat**, plain in colour and free of large logos or designs. It should have a **full-length zip to make the uniform visible** and not be an overhead or smock-style.
- **Students must not wear coats indoors other than in the canteen at break and lunch when the jumper must also be worn.**
- **Mid-layers, hoodies or outer garments** that do not meet our description of a coat are **not uniform** and students will be asked to remove them. They may be confiscated for the day. Circumstances such as being cold or not having required uniform items in school will not be accepted as an excuse. Students can stay indoors all day in canteen spaces or hubs if they need warmth.
- Hats, gloves and scarves should not be worn indoors. Caps are not permitted.



*No hoodies, no quarter zips, no busy patterns, no back prints or large logos.*

# Skirt length



There must be three dark stripes visible below the school jumper.

*Students will accrue conduct points and possibly more serious sanctions for **persistent or wilful** breaches of the behaviour policy.*

*The judgement of year leader or member of SLT is final in these matters.*

# Jewellery

- Earrings: small, plain studs only
- Necklaces: not permitted
- Bracelets: not permitted
- Rings: one ring permitted on each hand
- Facial piercings: clear or tiny studs. “Newness” will not be accepted as excuse not to meet this expectation and we ask families to support this aim.

*Students will be asked to remove jewellery that breaches policy and it may be confiscated and placed in reception. Our confiscation policy may apply to bracelets, rings and necklaces. **Students cannot access some practical lessons if they do not follow expectations. Jewellery will need to be removed in some lessons.***

*Students will accrue conduct points and possibly more serious sanctions for **persistent or wilful** breaches of the behaviour policy. The judgement of year leader or member of SLT is final in these matters.*

# Hair and make-up

- Hair must be natural in colouring and colouring styles (e.g. no extreme contrasts or patterns).
- Hair accessories or coverings should be minimal and should be navy, black, grey or white.
- Make-up should be neutral and natural skin tones.
- False eye-lashes and false nails are not permitted.

*Students will accrue conduct points and possibly more serious sanctions for **persistent or wilful** breaches of the behaviour policy. The judgement of year leader or member of SLT is final in these matters.*

# Additional Items

- Items such as badges, attachments or any other ***items not listed as uniform are not uniform.***
- The only exceptions are symbols of charities or school or community attainment.



# Apron

- One apron is required for practical work in **art and technology lessons** and students cannot access some machinery or cooking facilities unless they wear one. Uniformity offer an apron that we recommend. Any alternative must be plain in colour.

# Legacy Uniform Items

## *Years 8 – 10, 2026 onwards*

Students in Years 8 - 10 who have uniform that they do not wish to replace yet may wear it in the following combinations:



- **Blazer**, tie, shirt
- **Blazer**, tie, plain v-neck knitted jumper, shirt

***Students are to wear legacy uniform or new uniform and should not combine the two.***

# Legacy Uniform Items

## *Year 11 2026-2027 only*

Students in **Years 11 only** will be offered maximum flexibility for their 32 weeks of lessons left with us.

- (No tie)
- Shirt (it would be unwise to wear one layer in winter)
- Shirt and plain or branded jumper
- Shirt and blazer
- Polo and blazer
- Polo and branded jumper (new uniform)

***There must be no “non-uniform items” worn indoors.***
