



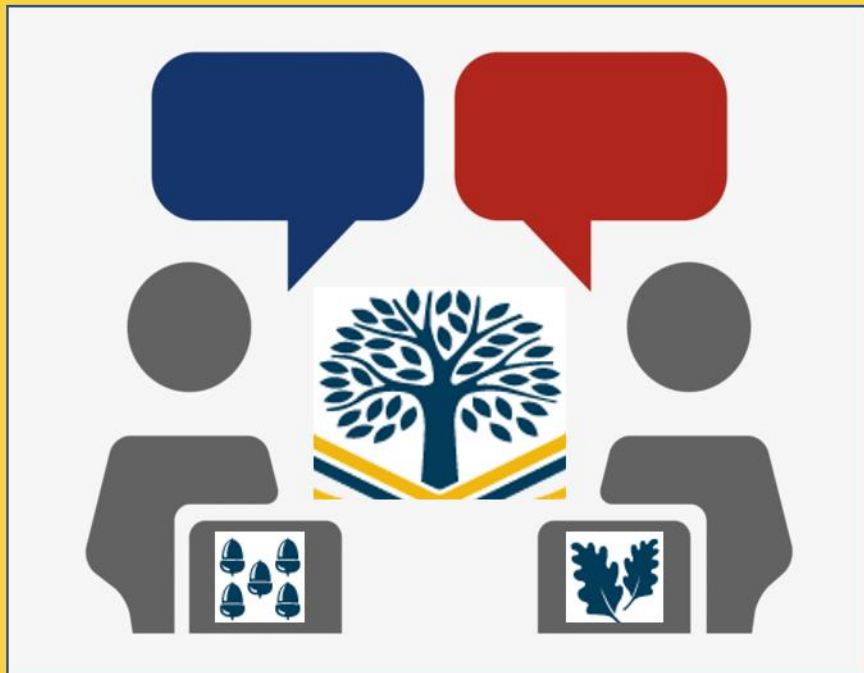

"Honestly being an MYP was one of the best experiences of my school career. Whilst it can be scary to put yourself out there it's so worth it, even my peers who weren't elected went on to take part in some amazing local initiatives - like attending biweekly Youth Senate meetings with the Council and taking part in regional forums called Youthforia. When I was an MYP one of our priorities was improving local mental health services which led to some promising interaction with CAMHS. Another key responsibility is holding meetings and distributing surveys to schools in the area - to make sure local priorities are represented at the national level. In terms of opportunities for personal growth, my experience as an MYP led me to give a speech at the Despatch Box in the House of Commons advocating for Votes at 16. The experience certainly stretched my comfort zone and public speaking skills - to the extent that since then I've chaired sessions in Parliament and the European Commission (via my internship). Go for it!"

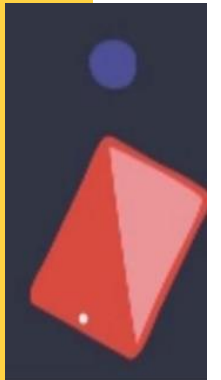


Tarporley will be looking to submit entries for the BBC young reporter competition.
