UCAS APPLICATIONS

Over 20 students have now sent off their UCAS applications, with university offers rolling in each day. Three students now have all 5 offers and many are preparing for interviews and the submission of digital creative portfolios.

We have a rigorous system with lots of support for students – from the whole Sixth Form team and subject staff. We pride ourselves on the quality of our applications, and there is no doubt that we are in a very competitive climate, as this year group has a boom birth rate and there have been many deferrals following the covid pandemic.

ALL applications must be in by Thursday 15th December - end of term. Although the official deadline is in January, it is imperative that students are organised, as we have mock exams in the first fortnight after the holidays. Students certainly do not want to be worrying about their application whilst also managing exams.

Once students have submitted their five choices (these are not placed in order of preference on the form). Students then select their two favourite universities: FIRM and INSURANCE. It is important to choose these carefully, and not rush this decision. The final two choices should offer reassurance: an aspirational top choice and lower grades for a back-up option. City visits / Mock results / realistic goals will determine the final decision.

BESST TRIAL – KING'S COLLEGE LONDON

We have been invited as one of only 60 schools in the UK to participate in a clinical trial run by BESST, at King's College, London. Nineteen students applied and were subsequently selected to complete a survey on wellbeing, mental health and stress management.
